



PATH Community/City/County Model

Mission

To ignite a great awakening by linking arms with other Christians to glorify Jesus through humble, unified, desperate prayer and action.

Vision

- Prayer at the heart of every Christian, family, church, business, institution and city.
- Christians to unite in prayer and action to share God's love across the City/County.
- A Missional model of Church that is repeatable and sustainable.
- Christians to bless and pray with 'Lost and Broken people.'
- Thousands of people saved and disciplined to follow Jesus.
- The transformation of culture in line with the Kingdom of God.
- See appendix 1 for the biblical basis for the PATH mission, vision and strategy.

Strategy

- Small organic local prayer groups multiplying in communities across the City/County.
- Dedicated prayer and intercession for the City/County.
- A City/County planning and advisory team. See appendix 2
- Local groups discern people's needs and plan how to share God's love in word and action.
- See appendix 3 for Characteristics and Values.

PATH Community/City/County Model

Implementation Plan

Prayer and Intercession

- Appoint a leader/s to coordinate the prayer initiatives including:
 - 30 Minute Prayer Challenge (30MPC)– see Appendix 4.
 - ‘Rooftop Encounters’ – to hear from God for your community/city/county.
 - A dedicated group for prayer and intercession across the City/County.

See Appendix 5 for more detail.

Structure

A planning team and an advisory team for each city/county.

A small central team to serve the community groups and for wider initiatives across the city/county – 3.5 Full Time for say 3 months (alternatively, the roles can be split between many people). **It’s critical to appoint people who have been gifted by God for the role and not just a volunteer! For example, have they done a similar role before?**

Leader/s for PATH in the City/County

To develop, coordinate and implement the Community/City/County plan, working humbly with:

- the leader for prayer and intercession;
- the church and ministry leaders, media etc.;
- the PATH national/regional leaders;
- partners, including donors; and
- the key functional leaders.

Leader/s for Key Functions including:

1. **Communications, Marketing & PR** (this could be covered by several individuals)

Working with the PATH leader/s identify and implement a communication plan covering:

- I. What needs to be communicated;
- II. To whom – internal and external;
- III. When; and
- IV. How - Internal - written, Zoom, F2F etc.
 - External – social media, radio, TV, film/video etc. (in the NE Ohio pilot, social media was the most effective and radio and leaflets ineffective).

2. **Operations** (this could be covered by several individuals)

To cover all other items, including:

- I. Tents of Meeting;
- II. On-line initiatives e.g. Gloop, BEH etc.
- III. Bookkeeping;

- IV. Partnerships;
- V. Training;
- VI. Follow up;
- VII. Volunteers;
- VIII. Public Sq./Park gathering.
- IX. Other – legal, insurance etc.;

3. IT (Part Time role)

To support the infrastructure for the central team

1. Communication, Marketing and PR – what, where, how and when.

- Efficient and effective communication of the mission, vision, strategy and tactics:
 - Community groups;
 - to churches and ministries;
 - on social media and other channels such as radio, TV, print etc.; and
 - other channels (NB in the NE Ohio pilot – radio, leaflets and mass mailing (to every pastor) were **not** effective).
- Start communicating the events 4 weeks out.
- Ensure the branding and messaging is consistent e.g. web site, social media, email etc.
- Check and double check that commitments are carried through (work with the Operations person) e.g. to serve in a TOM.
- Regularly encourage people to Text HOPE to 216-293-6655 if they're interested in becoming a Christian, they want to volunteer, donate, and/or want information on PATH – see appendix 5.
- Ensure consistency of message and branding – always loving and respectful.
- We must deliver what we say.
- Funding – let people know how to donate to PATH – on-line, text, mail etc.

2. Operations

To cover all other items, including:

I. **Tents of Meeting** – see appendix 6

Coordinate the Tents of Meeting (TOM) including:

- Provision of the TOM (free or rented);
- Location;
- Resourcing – teams for welcome, ambiance, resources etc.;
- Scheduling – ministries, people, worship teams, training, follow up etc.

II. **On-line initiatives e.g. Gloop, BEH etc.**

- Establish a team to manage the contacts that come through the Gloop partnership.
- Appoint someone to oversee and promote the BEH initiative.
- Be alert for other on-line partnerships for PATH to reach 'Lost and Broken people.'
- Work closely with the Communications, Marketing and PR team to promote the on-line initiatives.
- See appendix 7 for more information

III. Bookkeeping

- Manage the collection, bookkeeping and banking of all donations.
- Provide MI to the leader/s.

IV. Partnerships – see appendix 7

- Manage the efficient and effective operation of all partnerships.
- Provide MI to the Communication/PR team.
- Adjust the process when needed.

V. Training – see appendix 8

- Ensure all volunteers go through the ‘3 Circles’ training [click here](#)
- Provide on-line training to volunteers.

VI. Follow up – see appendix 8

Ask people to text HOPE to 216 293 6655 and we will follow up with people as follow:

- I want to volunteer. *We send them a list of ministries* to contact and engage them in the PATH roll out.*
- I’m interested in becoming a Christian. *We will point them to the on-line 3 Circles presentation and Foundations course and link them to a local church/Alpha course.*
- I need help in my life, but don’t know where to turn. *We will send them a list of ministries* to contact and link them to a local church/Alpha course.*
- Send me updates about Prayer at the Heart. We add them to our distribution list.

VII. Volunteers

- Recruit volunteers on line, in face to face meetings etc.
- Connect volunteers to their preferred ministry e.g. prayer, specialty ministry.
- Work with the communications team to ensure volunteers understand what, where, when and how they will be serving in the TOM and/or the central gathering.

VIII. Public Sq./Park gathering – see appendix 9.

IX. Other – legal, insurance etc.;

Address the legal, insurance and other items that may arise from the PATH initiatives.

3. IT Support all the IT needs of the Central Team, the TOM and the public gathering.

Pastors and Ministry Leaders

Provide clear succinct briefing to pastors and ministry leaders to ensure they understand:

- The heart and values of PATH;
- The commitment to unity and mobilization;
- This is a movement, not an event;
- Which TOM they will be supporting
- The commitment to serve e.g. provide a worship team for a TOM; Etc.

Expenses and Funding – a budget of \$40,000 should cover a 2-week initiative for a city/county.

Biblical Basis for PATH

We believe God's word has the strategy to see a great awakening across the land.

Unity

If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. 2 Chronicles 7:14

“...that they may be brought to complete unity. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me. John 17:23

Christians are unified in the person of Jesus. We focus on Him as we reach out to ‘Lost and Broken people.’ The things that divide are left within ‘the buildings’ e.g. issues such as the sacraments, baptism, end times etc.

‘By my name’ – our only focus is Jesus – to exalt His name.

Humility – dependence on God, serving one another with broken spirits and contrite hearts.

Prayer, fasting and intercession – we are desperate for God because we know only He can rescue America!

Turn from our wicked ways (selfish ways) – our home is heaven – we are sojourners with a mission on earth to glorify God by finishing the work He has given us, to rescue precious souls for eternity!

Mobilize

For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Ephesians 6:12

The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. 2 Corinthians 4:4

“You are the light of the world...let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.” Matthew 5:14,16

He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal the sick. Luke 9:2

Lord appointed seventy-two⁹ others and sent them two by two ahead of him to every town and place where he was about to go... Heal the sick who are there and tell them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' Luke 10:1, 9

"I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven." Luke 10:18

To shift the spiritual darkness over the nation that influences culture, government, the education system, juridical system, business, etc., the light has to shine. God could do this without any involvement by Christians but, in every move of God through history, He has always done it through His people.

Scripture and history give the answer. When Christians unify and mobilize the darkness shifts, the Kingdom of God is revealed and there is a transformation of culture and society.

Christians must unify and mobilize!

Planning Team and Advisory Team

A planning team and an advisory team are needed to steward PATH for city and/or county. However, 30MPC groups can operate before planning/advisory teams are established.

Planning Team

Purpose:

- To identify and agree the larger initiatives that will glorify Jesus Christ and extend His Kingdom in NE Ohio, Ohio and across the nation;
- To agree and oversee an implementation plan for each initiative, including roles and responsibilities, strategy, timing and resources;
- To steward Kingdom values and character to maintain humility, harmony, courage and the unity of the Spirit;
- To encourage and support the organic initiatives at a local level that glorify Jesus Christ and extend His Kingdom;
- To work closely with the Advisory Team to encourage prayer, unity and the mobilization of Christians across NE Ohio; and
- To maintain prayer at the core of all activity.

Time: Average 1 hour/week – most meetings will be by Zoom

Advisory Team

Purpose:

- To work closely with the Planning Team to encourage prayer, unity and the mobilization of Christians across NE Ohio.
- To encourage and support the Planning Team to steward Kingdom values and character to maintain humility, harmony, courage and the unity of the Spirit;
- To offer help and advice to the Planning Team on the larger initiatives in NE Ohio; &
- To offer help and advice on the organic initiatives taking place across NE Ohio.

Time: Average 1 hour/month – most meetings will be by Zoom

Characteristics and Values

- PATH is an organic Movement of Hope that flows from the Heart! Proverbs 4:23
- Jesus first and only!
- The motivation is a love for Jesus Christ and a longing to see Him glorified on earth as He is in Heaven.
- Founded and lead by God’s word, in the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Run by Christians from all ‘tribes, and tongues and ages’ working together in unity with a single purpose – to exalt the name of Jesus Christ through prayer and evangelism.
- Volunteer based.
- Dependent on God for financial and other resources.
- There is no political agenda.
- PATH is not about any big names, ministries etc.
- Leaders have received Jesus Christ as their Savior and Lord and are living in line with God’s word.

Values

- Pray continually about the mission, strategy and implementation plan.
- Praise and thank God for His provision of resource and fruit.
- Live by God’s word - memorize scripture.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you daily- don’t grieve, quench or resist Him.
- No unwholesome words – don’t grieve the Holy Spirit. Ephesians 4:29-30
- Love - from God and to others.
- In God’s love there is light that dispels the darkness.
- Grace and truth (in that order).
- Wisdom from above - James 3:17
- Humility - dependence on God and serving one another.
- Walk by Faith - God is in control!
- Courage - Go and do it!
- Mercy - forgiveness triumphs
- The Cross - die daily - don’t take offense.
- Excellence with grace – aim for excellence, be quick to forgive errors.
- Radical generosity.
- Have a big vision – Daniel 11:32
- Be an encourager – God is with us and for us!
- God is our provider – 2 Corinthians 9:8, Hebrews 13:20-21, 2 Thessalonians 1:11
- Work in the unforced rhythms of His grace – Matthews 11:28-30 MSG).
- Integrity – deliver what you say.
- Make every effort to live at peace with everyone...Hebrews 12:14 – avoid politics, denominational or other contentious issues – **Focus on Jesus and Him alone.**
- PATH is a movement not an event!

The 30 Minute Prayer Challenge

Pray with one or two Christians, where you live and/or work, for 30 minutes a week.

Why

Because:

1. America desperately needs a great spiritual awakening¹ – **it's our only hope!**
2. Jesus commanded us to always pray.²
3. It will encourage the Christian unity that Jesus prayed for, which will lead to a great awakening.³

When and Where

An agreed time and place such as early morning or lunch time, in a home, conference room or office, community hall, school or other convenient venue.

How

Start with family (e.g. husband and wife) and invite friends, neighbors, etc. At work, invite friends and work colleagues. When you get to 12 multiply - See Guidelines.

What

Pray through the Lord's Prayer and seek His face (His presence). See appendix A.

Vision

A great awakening with prayer in every community and business, with Christ first in every Christians heart and millions saved. A great awakening sweeping across America and around the world like a mighty Tsunami wave.

Guidelines – 30MPC

- Keep it simple, be courageous - go for it!
- Unity - pray with Christians in your community.⁴ Start with family (husband & wife), friends, neighbors etc. Ask God for opportunities to invite others to pray with you.
- Do the thirty-minute prayer challenge in addition to any other prayer you are doing.
- Start and end on time. Welcome - pray – close the meeting.
- Pray through the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, in the love of God and from the fellowship of the Holy Spirit.
- ‘Seek God’s face’ – this means, seek His presence. Ask God to manifest His presence in your community. It’s His presence that brings a great awakening.
- Pray from the heart⁵ and be sensitive - keep the prayers short. Allow time for others.
- Make this a special prayer meeting to pray and seek God’s presence together:
 - Be kind, encourage, build up, strengthen and forgive one another.
 - Be merciful and gracious to one another.
 - Not all Christians are comfortable with the gift of tongues, so please be sensitive to others and the Holy Spirit.
 - Don’t grieve the Holy Spirit- Never criticize, back bite, judge...
 - Don’t quench the Holy Spirit – be open to hear from God.⁶
- Avoid discussion/arguments on controversial issues that undermine love and prayer.
- Prayer walk your community, asking for God’s blessing on your neighbors.
- Be alert to Satan’s attacks to stop you from praying.
- Invite others to join the prayer group.
- When the group reaches a certain number, multiply by starting new groups of two and three in your community, and grow again! We suggest a group should be no more than 12.
- Every month, gather the groups together e.g. in a local elementary school, to pray and plan on how to share God’s love in the community in word and action.
- Keep the groups local – Christians pray and work together to share God’s love in their community and/or workplace.
- Pray the promises of God found in scripture. “Put the Lord in remembrance of His promises, keep not silence” (Isaiah 62:6 AMPC).
- Never underestimate the power of prayer.
- Use www.prayerattheheart.org website for ideas on how to:
 - Reach ‘lost and broken people,’ including a Tent of Meeting;
 - Point people to a local Alpha course (or a similar course);
 - Provide Foundations teaching for new believers; and
 - Use on-line resources such as the BEH (Bless Every Home) App to pray for everyone in the community, Gloop and Rooftop Encounters.
- Humbly, ask to link arms with churches, ministries and other Christians.

30MPC - Pray through the Lord's Prayer – spend 3/4 minutes on each section

1. **Our Father in Heaven hallowed be your name.** Thank and praise God for:
 - a. Being your loving Heavenly Father who deeply loves you.
 - b. He so loves us that He gave His only son to rescue us...!
 - c. His beauty as seen in creation – the sun, moon and stars, birds, animals etc.
 - d. His mercy and grace to human kind.

2. **Your Kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.** Pray for:
 - a. God's kingdom to come in your community and/or workplace;
 - b. The love and worship of Jesus Christ to be first in people's hearts, including a love for His word – The Bible;
 - c. God's blessing on every individual, marriage, family, community, business, school, government, hospitals, Police, First Responders etc.;
 - d. Prayer to be at the center of every individual, family, community, business, government etc.
 - e. Unconditional love between people, for forgiveness, mercy and grace;
 - f. Love, peace and joy to reign;
 - g. God's light to drive out the darkness – for people to be set free from addiction, immorality, injustice, corruption, jealousy, pride...
 - h. Healing for the sick – name specific needs;
 - i. The needs of the poor, brokenhearted, lonely etc. to be met;
 - j. Marriages and families to be blessed;
 - k. Righteousness, justice and humility to reign; and
 - l. People to love the things God loves and to hate the things He hates.

3. **Give us this day our daily bread.** Pray for:
 - a. Specific needs for you and your family – forgiveness, love, joy... ;
 - b. The specific needs of people in your community;
 - c. The poor, the old, the weak and the sick; and
 - d. The needs of government, education, hospitals, Police and First Responders etc.

4. **Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.** Pray for:
 - a. The Holy Spirit to search your heart and bring to mind anything that needs to be confessed and repented of;
 - b. Courage to confess your sins to one another;
 - c. Courage and strength to decide to repent – turn away from the sin/s;
 - d. God to pour His love into your heart to give you the motivation to live with an attitude of forgiveness – to forgive people before an offense is committed;
 - e. Humility and strength to never take offense – “I have been crucified with Christ...”⁷ and

f. For forgiveness, mercy and love to flow in your community.

5. Don't let us yield to temptation but rescue us from the evil one. Pray for:

- a. Discernment, sensitivity to the Holy Spirit and alertness to resist every scheme of Satan to ensnare you in sin;
- b. The grace to say "No" to anything that will grieve, quench or resist the Holy Spirit;⁸
- c. Wisdom to avoid putting yourself in a position to be tempted;
- d. Self-discipline to build yourself up in the faith through prayer, worship, meditating and memorizing scripture and fellowship with other Christians;
- e. Strength to guard your heart from any roots of unforgiveness, bitterness, discouragement, disappointment, pride, jealousy etc. and
- f. As above, for your community.

6. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen. Pray for:

- a. Revelation and understanding that:
 - i. God holds everything together by the power of His word;⁹
 - ii. We live and move and have our being in Him;¹⁰
 - iii. Everything is from Him and through Him and to Him and He gets all the glory;¹¹ and
 - iv. God is outside time, matter and space and He is working His eternal plan and purpose out in and through the events in your life and on earth.
- b. A willing heart to say "Yes" to whatever God's will is for your life¹²; and
- c. To have wisdom and passion to set your heart on the things of Heaven and to live your life as a sojourner fully surrendered to God's will.

Prayer and Intercession

In addition to the 30MPC groups, a dedicated group of prayer warriors/intercessors for the City/County

The following activity/best practice came from the prayer/intercessory group for the NE Ohio pilot.

Activity

- Weekly update/prayer calls (Zoom Mondays and Conference Tuesdays) – thanksgiving, repentance and worship. Prayer for unity, leaders, missional teams, pastors, business and city leaders, revival, awakening, harvest of souls, logistics, finances, technology, weather, TOM, national partners etc.
- Prayer alerts and invitations to unite in prayer. Covered, waters, borders, ports, lakes etc.
- Participate in PATH's weekly national prayer Zoom call.
- Be inclusive and invite other prayer groups to participate.
- Joined with national and local initiatives including, National Day of Prayer and Korean intercessory team.
- A wider cross section of prayer leaders – national and local, missional, First Nations.
- Many prayer initiatives including, rooftop encounters, prayer walks, praying for Lake Eyrie and ports via a ferry, strategic locations/buildings – Cleveland Public Sq., strategic partnerships such as Gloop and Bless Every Home.
- Recruited and trained leaders for 'alter workers' (e.g. TOM) and deliverance ministry.
- Tents of Meeting (TOM) – Invited the presence of the Lord and He came!

Best Practice

- Before engaging in the battle prepare – no unconfessed sin, unforgiveness, bitterness, disunity, bad attitude etc.
- Use all prayer tools – praise, worship, thanksgiving, gratitude, declaration, fasting etc.
- Keep yourself, families, prayer partners etc. covered in prayer.
- Maintain balance – don't overcommit, rest well, exercise and good diet etc.
- Keep your heart – banish discouragement, disappointment, unbelief, offense, judgement, a divided heart (must be 100% in!) etc. Proverbs 4:23 Confess sin immediately.
- Keep a good perspective leading to humility, brokenness, desperation etc.
- All glory to Jesus – put-aside reputation, ministry, selfish ambition etc.
- Be alert, sensitive and obedient to the 'nudges of the Holy Spirit.
- By faith and not fear – the outcome and numbers are in God's hand.
- The Power of One - in praying, ministering and audience.
- Understand roles and responsibilities and keep to these.
- Follow up – invite responders to text hope to 2162936655 or complete a response card.

Tents of Meeting

A Tent of Meeting (TOM) is a safe neutral place where people can experience God's love in practical ways, such as help and prayer for addicts, the mentally ill, marriage and families etc., and during times of praise, worship and prayer.

- Local Tents of Meeting (TOM) in a Public area (Sq., park etc.).
- Activity in the TOM to be owned by community 30MPC groups and/or local churches and/or ministries.
- Praise, worship, prayer and ministry to take place from 12pm-2pm.
- Christians serve with specialty ministries from 2.30pm-6pm, to meet local needs such as addicts, mentally ill, Seniors, Business Community etc.
- Evangelism – various initiatives to reach 'Lost and Broken people.'
- Every evening 6.30pm-9pm have a specific theme such as:
 - Gen Z Ministry – praise, worship and prayer;
 - Prayer for the Sick – praise, worship, ministry and prayer; and
 - Night of Hope – praise, worship, testimonies and an alter call.
- Where possible use tents owned by Christians. 30' x 60' is a good size to seat 150 people.
- Suggested Staffing - Four important managers are identified to oversee a tent of meeting in a local area. Each manager should draft a few helpers for support and backup.

1. Logistics Manager

- ✓ Tent set-up/tear-down
- ✓ Tables and chairs
- ✓ Electrical hook-up
- ✓ P.A. system
- ✓ Lighting
- ✓ Portable heaters
- ✓ Bathroom accessibility
- ✓ Banners including Text HOPE to 216 293 6655

2. Spiritual Manager

- ✓ Manage time flow during the meeting - keep and/or adjust the schedule. Make sure the speakers know their allotted time. Intervene when speakers are going too long or off topic.
- ✓ Sanction or caution "words from the Lord". Discernment needed.
- ✓ Sense the working of the Holy Spirit and make adjustments.

3. Scheduling Manager

- ✓ Master schedule created and published online

- ✓ Recruitment and training for:
 - Worship team;
 - Testimonies;
 - Gospel presentation;
 - Follow up -
 - Greeters and general ambiance; and
 - Resources – Bibles, training etc.

4. Marketing Manager

- ✓ Online presence
- ✓ Radio presence
- ✓ Flyers, handouts
- ✓ Connections with other ministries
- A large (e.g. 1,000 seat tent) located in a public location e.g. a park, on the 4th and 5th days – Saturday and Sunday - for thanksgiving, praise and worship, testimony, alter call, and call to action/next steps.
- Follow Up - text hope to 2162936655 or complete a response card to be pointed to the Foundation course and regular updates.
- Training for outreach and follow up – this is automated from the text number [click for more information](#)
- Teams to manage:
 - ✓ On line connections;
 - ✓ Marketing and PR;
 - ✓ Follow up;
 - ✓ Funding;
 - ✓ Etc.

Christians gather on a rooftop to pray and hear from God on how to reach their community with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Several encounters took place as part of the PATH NE Ohio Pilot. PATH/Gloo Partnership

Purpose: To connect with people in the on-line world for prayer and ministry

Process

- Gloo connects individuals by text, in agreed Zip codes, for prayer and/or ministry help.
- PATH has a clearing team that appoints the requests to a prayer team or a ministry team.
- A relationship is developed with the individual and, when appropriate, a face to face meeting is arranged e.g. at a TOM, and they are encouraged to receive Christ as their Savior and Lord.

Planning – Feedback from the NE Ohio pilot

- Keep the leader(s) of the GLOO team in all planning meetings and decisions that are made regarding GLOO.
- Recruit and explain that GLOO is an online ministry that uses text messages to communicate with subscribers.
- Plenty of training and follow-up for all those who would like to volunteer to pray with those online. There should be several online meetings just to talk it through and allow questions.
- When each volunteer signs up, have them put their type of ministry behind their name. It would help those who are assigning the explorer/prayer requests (e.g., marriage & fam, mental health, addiction, adoption, general prayers, etc.)
- Make sure each volunteer turns on their notifications in GLOO to determine how they will receive an alert when they have been assigned an explorer/prayer request.
- It's important to respond within 24 hours to each new Explorer and/or prayer request that has been assigned to the volunteer team.
- Once each volunteer goes through the GLOO training, make sure each person understands and is ready to respond to the explorers and prayer requests. It's a simple process that GLOO has, but some people do it their own way! For example, two or three people responded to the same prayer requests that were not assigned to them. It's about building a rapport with the person.
- Each volunteer must understand that GLOO continues after a PATH initiative. Their help is needed on an on-going basis.
- Each volunteer needs to be trained on Relink several times to be able to refer the explorers to the proper programs available through Relink.
- Some of the people were desperate and GLOO could be their last cry for help.
- Need more people to help with the mentally ill and with addicts.

Training and Follow Up

The goal is for every Christian serving in a PATH initiative to be trained and comfortable in sharing the gospel with a 'Lost and Broken' person

We use on-line training for the 3 Circles method of sharing the gospel. [Click here for the training.](#)

Face to face and Zoom calls are used to train and brief Christians on how the TOM and other parts of the PATH roll out work.

Response and Follow Up

We have an automated process, to follow up with people as follows:

People are encouraged to text HOPE to 216 293 6655. The text response asks them to complete their contact information and then to check one or more of the following options (our follow up is in red):

- I want to volunteer. **We send them a list of ministries* to contact and engage them in the PATH roll out.**
- I'm interested in becoming a Christian. **We will point them to the [on-line 3 Circles presentation and Foundations course](#) (these are being added to the web site) and link them to a local church/Alpha course.**
- I need help in my life, but don't know where to turn. **We send them a list of ministries* to contact and link them to a local church/Alpha course.**
- Send me updates about Prayer at the Heart. **We add them to our distribution list.**
